Dear Community Member:

Over the past few months, we've continued to work closely with residents in the Red Head area to answer questions and address concerns. In some cases, additional properties bordering or near the Project Eider Rock study area have been acquired. We have enclosed a new version of the Eider Rock study area map which identifies changes in the study area. The actual size of the proposed refinery will be approximately 590 acres within this approximately 2,600 acre study area. The specific location of the refinery within these boundaries has not yet been established, but will be determined during the course of the environmental assessment and engineering design.

This updated version of the study area map is being submitted this week to provincial and federal regulators as part of the environmental assessment processes.

We also received a number of suggestions about the addition of local landmarks on the study area map. Based on these suggestions, this new map includes several local landmarks.

As you know, we are still in the early phases of Eider Rock with many milestones to work towards, including a complete examination of the project's feasibility, design and environmental assessments. On April 5, 2007 the New Brunswick Department of Environment released the draft guidelines for its Environmental Impact Assessment process, which you can view online at <http://www.gnb.ca/0009/0377/0002/0005-e.asp> or in person at any of the following locations:
